

#### About the Playwright

George Michael Cohan (July 3, 1878 - November 5, 1942) was an American entertainer, playwright, composer, lyricist, actor, singer, dancer and theatrical producer. Cohan began his career as a child, performing with his parents and sister in a vaudeville act known as The Four Cohans. He wrote more than 50 shows and published more than 300 songs during his lifetime, including the standards Over There, Give My Regards to Broadway, The Yankee Doodle Boy and You're a Grand Old Flag. Known in the decade before World War I as "the man who owned Broadway", he is considered the father of American musical comedy. A statue of Cohan in Times Square New York City commemorates his contributions to American theatre. Cohan penned Seven Keys to Baldpate in 1913 as a biting satire of the mystery thriller-a serious comedy! It was Cohan's most successful play and was a huge success on and off Broadway, inspiring 7 films.

#### Dírector's Note

Ever since LOST picked Seven Keys to Baldpate, this 106 year - old comedy, surprised and delighted us with its witty, quirky characters, fast pace and clever dialogue. Earl Derr Biggers originally wrote the novel Seven Keys to Baldpate in 1913. George M. Cohan riding on the novel's success, wrote the play adaptation.

A New York review said "Seven Keys to Baldpate is a frenzied farce and melodrama gone mad. For good measure, it is whimsy and satire and that sort of April-fooling, of rounding on one's work and making fun of it."

It has been a fun and creative challenge for the ensemble and crew to work with a play that has vaudevillian roots and stylized dialogue. We have done our best in the editing and rehearsal process to slightly shift the lens, so the audience can view this old classic with a contemporary slant. Our treatment adds some modern-day farcical elements and still honors Cohen's fine satirical writing. On this wintry day in December, we hope you are warmed to this theatrical romp that takes place on the 'lonesomest spot on earth'.
